So That You May Know You Are Born of God I John 5:1-2

Why was the Gospel of John written? "So that you may <u>BELIEVE</u> that Jesus is the Messiah... and have life in His name." (Jo 20:31) Why was the Letter of I John written? "So that you may <u>KNOW</u> that you have eternal life." (I Jo 5:13) All spiritual "knowing" starts with "believing" (See John 6:69). But as "believing" begins to dissolve into "knowing", we start to live more confidently out of what we know. Make no mistake, we are always "faithing"... doubting our doubts, trusting the unseen, taking God at His word in the face of apparent denial. But as we increasingly live out of what we have believed and come to know, we more naturally begin to live out of an "innerstantial" than a "circum-stantial" life.

All Christian knowing starts with one simple faith choice: Believing Jesus Christ to be the Son of God and Savior of the world. (Jo 1:12; 3:16; I Jo 4:9, 5:1) Through faith in Christ and His Saving Life, we receive the miraculous gift of new birth. (Jo 3:3,6) Being born again is no metaphor, it is our actual condition. We receive life "from God' (I Jo 4:4,6)... miraculous, conceived in love, all of grace. (There are no self-caused, self-generated re-births!) And we can come to know that we are born of God.

How do we know that? Certainly the Holy Spirit bears witness to our human spirits that it is so (Ro 8:14-17). But John gives us another indicator: our "want to" changes! "By this we know..." (I Jo 5:2) - our new birth comes with a new concern—we want to love God and His children. The faithful, loving character of God in Christ was imported into our spirits at our new birth. His "want to" - to faithfully obey His Father and to sacrificially love His Father's children—has become our "want to". The most natural, joyful, and fulfilling choices we will make, therefore, are to obey our Father's directives and to love our Father's children. In fact, for John, to faithfully obey God and to sacrificially love others are inseparable concepts. (I Jo 3:16-19; 4:20-21) And all that we need to make both happen we have freely received in Christ at our new birth.

In other words, God's children, His born again ones, will never be at home again in disobedience, rebellion or defiance. We will never be at home again in indifference, hatefulness, or contemptuousness. (You are free to choose such things, but they are so out of character with the born-again you that there will be no rest, no peace, no joy in them!) On the other hand, every time you choose the obedience of faith before God and His directives, every time you love another with the love of Christ in you for others... your awareness and your experience of your born-againness will grow, will solidify, will mature... into "knowing". And you will come to <u>KNOW</u> that you are, indeed, born of God!
